CHURCH BOOK OF THE REFORMED

Congregation on Beaver Creek in Orange County (now Guilford County), North Carolina, and is the beginning, at the time, Anno Domini 1772, and Samuel Suther a preacher of the Reformed Church by the Grace of God in Christ Jesus Our Lord.

Names of the Church<sup>1</sup>

"The Church on Beaver Creek" was the first name given the Church.

"The Klapp Church" was the second name given the Church.

"The Brick Church" was the third and last name given the Church.

Notes by Jame MacLamroc, County Historian of Guilford County:

The Reverent D. I. Offman was pastor of the Calvinist (someone crossed Out Calvinist and put Lutheran) German Reformed churches in eastern Guilford, including the Brick Church in southeast Guilford (some one crossed out "including the Brick Church in southeast Guilford"), for fifty years.

Guilford County was taken from Orange and Rowan counties when it was established in 1771 the eastern approximately two-fifths in which the Brick Church is located having come from Orange and the western approximately three-fifths having come from Rowan.

The Rev. Samuel Suther preached here before he became pastor.

The Rev. John W. Bithan is the only reformed minister buried in the Brick Church Cemetery. He lies 20 or 30 feet S. East from the Daniel Faust grave.

The Rev. Andrew Loretz was not an ordained minister at the Brick Church but his faithful work entitles him to all the honor.

The Rev. William Paisley was a Presbyterian minister but he was also like Loretz, a faithful supply.

Rev. Wm. C. Shaw was not ordained

Groff and Fesperman were students in the ministry.

Rev. J. R. Reily is written "Jacobus" in the record instead of James "Jacobus" being the German.

Rev. Wm. Paisley born Oct. 26, 1770, died March 10, 1857. Buried in Greensboro, NC.

Rev. Andrew Loretz born in Choir, Swiss. In 1762, died March 31, 1813. He lies at Daniel Church in Lincoln Co. NC.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE CONGREGATION

According to public notice previously given the congregation met in the Brick church on the 20th of May 1839 for the purpose of considering the propriety of repairing the church edifice.

Daniel Albright was called to the chair, and the Rev. John H. Crawford appointed secretary. The Rev. George A. Leopold was invited to take a seat as an advisory member.

The object of the meeting being made known it was resolved that The congregation should resolve into a committee of the whole and the Members shall be at liberty to leave their seats in order to examine in the church edifice and that they again take their seats in half an hour after having inspected the building the members taken their seats. The President desired to be relieved from the duties of the chair in as much as he experienced a difficulty in hearing the members speak. His request was granted and the Rev. George A. Lepold was called to fill his place.

The members were then called to upon respectively to express their opinions concerning the subject under consideration. They all concur in the opinion that the shattered condition of the walls render it necessary to rebuild the house where upon it was unanimously resolved that the walls shall be taken down to the foundation; that the roof shall be supported in its present position by such means as may be deemed most practicable; that the walls shall again be erected on their roof; that the walls shall be built the length of two bricks in thickness below the gallery and one and one half above; that the gallery shall be put up lengthwise in the house sloping towards the center, seven feet high in front, then feet wide at the sides and sixteen at the end; and that a building committee shall be appointed.

The following persons were then appointed to constitute the Building committee; Daniel Albright, John Clapp Sr., Daniel Faust, Daniel Clapp and Abraham Clapp.

A subscription paper was then handed around and \$562.00 was forthwith subscribed.

The congregation adjourned Sine die.

Proceeding of a meeting held on the 20th of April 1840.

According to notice previously given the congregation met at the Brick Church on the 20th of April 1840.

The meeting was organized by calling Col. Daniel Clapp to the chair and appointing W. A. Carrigan secretary. It was moved and seconded and carried that the Rev. Mr. Fritchey take his seat as

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an advisory member which he accordingly did. Moved and seconded that the house be built one story high and ten feet longer. The motion was lost.

A motion being put whether the members will sustain the commissioners in any expenses they may incur farther than the amount of the present subscription in pulling down and putting and securing the walls of the house. The vote being put, those present unanimously agreed to sustain the commissioners in proportion to the present amount of their subscriptions.

The congregation adjourned Sine die.

Stoner's (Steiner's) Church,  
Alamance County, N.C.

Stoner's Church became an active congregation about 1801. The church was dissolved about 1886. The cemetery is presently located in a pasture near the village of Belmont (near Graham) in Alamance County. It is thought that before they organized as Stoner's they were associated with the Lutherans who later formed St. Paul's Lutheran Church.

The Church book of Stoner's was translated from the original German by Reverend D. I. Offman. A copy was type from Rev. Offman's translation by Calvin Hinshaw in 1959. It is my understanding that a copy of the typed records is at Guilford College. I have also been told that the original records are in the Library at Catawba College, Salisbury, N.C. My information is that these records are in such a fragile condition that the public is no longer allowed to view them.

The following is from a copy of Calvin Hinshaw's transcription of Rev. D. I. Offman's translation. I have attempted to copy it exactly as typed. Any comments of my own will be in brackets [ ].

HERIOT CLARKSON AT GIBSONVILLE

Memorial Celebration At Gibsonville Cemetery On Sunday A Great Success

Yesterday was the annual memorial celebration at Gibsonville cemetery, and the occasion was in all respects a highly successful occasion. One of the largest crowds of many years gathered from all sections of eastern Guilford to join in the celebration. The cemetery has been much improved recently, drive-ways built for cars and parking, and many plots had been put in excellent condition. Flowers covered almost every grave. After a very impressive devotional service conducted by Rev. C. W. McClanahan of the Lutheran church, Dr. W. T. Whitsett gave the historical report for the past year, showing many researches into the history of all surrounding churches embracing Friedens, Gibsonville, Springwood, Low's Brick Church, Hawfields, Alamance, Buffalo and several others; including the early settlements over one hundred and seventy five years ago of the Friends, the Presbyterians, the Lutherans, the Reformed people, and the Moravians. Interesting incidents were mentioned concerning Bishop Edmund Gibson, Joseph and Andrew Gibson, early settlers here, and others. This feature is receiving much attention, and valuable publications have been issued, and are now under way.

Rev. S. M. Rankin, of Greensboro told the story of the original Patterson graveyard, now the Gibsonville cemetery, and the early history of Cedar Creek Presbyterian church, which was later merged into the creation in 1812 of Bethel Presbyterian church.

Ralph L. Steel, a native of the community, now a resident of Raleigh in fitting words introduced Justice Heriot Clarkson, telling of his constructive work in the legislation of prohibition, good roads, municipal government and other interesting matters.

Justice Clarkson took for his subject "Christianity, the hope of the world," and for one hour held the undivided attention of the great audience as he pictured in eloquent terms the worth, the power and the influence of the Christian religion. It was an address of unusual scope, and delivered with fine effect. Many tender and touching illustrations were given drawn from his own wide reading, and his experiences in life, and it is seldom that an audience gives to any speaker the absorbed attention that was paid to his words. As he closed, the audience by a rising vote showed its deep appreciation for his powerful plea. Friends crowded the platform from every direction to grasp his hand and testify to their appreciation of his fine address.

Music for the occasion was furnished by the church choirs from The M.E. and the M. P. churches, the Baptist church, and Sharon Lutheran church.

The committee elected to serve for the coming year consists of S. \_\_\_\_\_, chairman, M. J. Randolph sec; and, treas., and T. L. Flynn; Miss Olga Allen, and Miss Sallie Shephard. The treasurer's report showed much work done, and handsome balance in the treasury. A liberal contribution was added to this fund by those present. The collection was in charge of Rev. C. W. Clark, Rev. E. H. Nease, Dr. T. M. Johnson, and Hon. Gilliam Grissom of Raleigh.

As far as known Mr. McLean has not been questioned concerning the cause of the accident. He was considered a capable pilot of his own aircraft. The opinion has been advanced, without verification, that an occupant of the front compartment may have "frozen", to the dual controlled biplane and made it impossible for Pilot McLean to regain control of it.

Spectators at a ball game at Elon College saw the plane go into a spin but dismissed it as a trick stunt, as may be observed often when flyers go aloft to practice.

The annual gathering of the Greeson-Foust family association was held Thursday, Sept. 22nd at Brick church. In addition to the social features, there was an interesting exchange of information by various members of the families represented concerning their various lines of ancestry. Dinner was spread for all present on the church lawn.

The address of Rev. D.I. Offman was devoted to the subject of the genealogy of the two families represented. He presented a large chart of the Greeson family, showing Isaac Greeson as the original founder, of the family, in this part of the state. Isaac Greeson had four children, viz. Jacob, Nicholas, Margaret and Mintie. Margaret married a Lineberrer? (now known as Lineberry in this section), and Mintie married a Low, Jacob Greeson had eight children, as follows, Mary, Samuel, John, David, Isaac, Elizabeth, Jacob and Daniel. Nicholas Greeson had one son Samuel. The Rev. Jacob Greeson (Grierson) who is buried at Low's church is a son of Jacob, and a grandson of Isaac Greeson.

The Foust chart was then presented showing John Foust, born 1710, and his wife, Anna Barbara Albright Foust, born, 1719, as the founders of the Foust families of Guilford, Alamance, and Randolph counties. The nine children of this couple were as follows: Philip, John, Jacob, Christian (who married Anne Wolf). George (who married a Kivett), Barbara (who married Jacob Clapp.) Judith (who married Barney Clapp), Peter (who married a Snotherly,) and Daniel (who married a Snotherly.) In the ancient Stoner's graveyard near Belmont Mills some of these are buried, among them Peter Foust (Sept. 15, 1759-Sept. 26, 1808), Mary Foust (April 28, 1763-April 15, 1852), Philip Snotherly (1730-1791), Peter Foust (April 2, 1796-Feb. 8, 1856), the latter was elected an elder in the Reformed church in 1825. George Foust (March 30, 1792-Sept. 17, 1861), .Maria D. Foust (May 9, 1790-March 22, 1882.)

The second address of the day was by Dr. W. T. Whitsett of Whitsett who gave an interesting historical tracing of "The Story of the Family. He began in primitive times, and showed the family life of the various stages of human development. The earliest formal records of Indian, Greek, and Roman society how the family firmly established, even then. The village, the town, the city, etc., is only the growth, and of shoot of family growth. Clans and tribes split off as numbers multiply, and thus civilization grows. Scholars claim that the most civilized races may have lasted through the stages of Exogamy?, Tetomism, etc. Their theories were briefly touched upon. He spoke of the researches of McLennan, Lewis Morgan, Gillien?, Spencer and others. The story of the family as the very unit of civilization afforded many interesting lines of thought. Families in religious life, growth of schools, government, society, etc., were touched upon in the address.

PUBLIC MEETING IN GUILFORD COUNTY.

A meeting of the people of Guilford county was held at Cobles school-house, on Thursday, the 18th of August, Jeremiah Clapp, Esq., was called to preside, and Rev. G. W. Bowman appointed Secretary. On motion, the Chairman appointed W. M. Mebane, D. F. Clapp, Gid. Grieson, R. P. Shaw, Samuel Coble, A. T. Finley and G. William Welker, to prepare resolutions expressive of the sentiments of the meeting, who presented the following, which were unanimously adopted; Whereas, It is not only the privilege but the sacred right of the citizens of a free government to keep sleepless guard over their liberties and to perpetuate the blessings they have enjoyed under the Republican government inherited of their fathers; therefore we, a portion of the people, have assembled peaceable to petition the redress of grievances, and to express our views of such other matters as concern our welfare as a sovereign State, and thus by discussing such matters of public interest as concern our right as freemen, best prepare ourselves to guard our liberties against every encroachment of despotism. Therefore -

Resolved, That we protest against any and every attempt to subvert our present form of government or to change our republican institutions.

Resolved, That we protest against the interference of any European power in our affairs, or any attempt to place our State under foreign protection.

Resolved, That we solemnly protest against the suspension of the writ of habeas corpus, except only as provided for by the Constitution, and then only under the most urgent necessity; and demand the strict subjection of the military to the civil authority of the State.

Resolved, That we protest against every attempt to muzzle the Press, whether under the form of legislation, by usurped Executive power or by threats of mob violence, and that as a people born to the inheritance of freeman, we will resist every attempt to abridge the freedom of speech or to destroy the right of private property.

Resolved, That our State has been aggrieved by the common government in subjecting the people to the indignity of having most of the civil and many of the military offices, the duties of which pertain to North Carolina, filled by citizens of other States.

Resolved, That the people in this most critical period of their history, as a State, should be honestly and truthfully dealt with by their servants in power, and by the public press; that we shall hold all offenders in this respect as guilty of a great crime against the people; that our Representatives both in National and State legislature, in transacting business vital to the welfare of the people in secret session with closed doors, have violated the right of the people, destroyed mutual confidence, and improperly evaded the accountability which is due from public servants to their constituents.

Resolved, That as the Presidents has called for more troops, we protest against any more men being taken from this State, for North Carolina has done her whole duty in this disastrous war - her sons have gone forth by thousands to be cut down by disease and the sword, and no more men can be spared without subjecting the women and children to starvation and surrendering the country to lawless violence.

Resolved, That we believe this unnatural and bloody war can never be brought to an end by arms; we therefore call upon the President and Congress to make an immediate effort to secure an armistice of six months with a view to institute negotiations for peace, for extermination or slavery must follow persistence in this wicked war.

Resolved, That we are not only opposed to taxation without representation, but we are also opposed to being taxed by representatives in Congress, many of whom have no constituency.

Resolved, that we will not support any man for a seat in the next Congress who will not pledge himself to use all proper means to effect the repeal of the tithe law and the establishment of an equitable and lasting peace.

Resolved, That we are justly proud of the noble conduct of our North Carolina soldiers - that we deeply sympathize with them in all their hardships and pray that they may soon be permitted to enjoy the blessings of freedom and peace in their homes.

Resolved, That Gov. Vance, by the generous employment of all the powers of his intellect and heart to make the resources of the State serve the people, has fully justified the lavish confidence reposed in him as his election; and that we call upon him now to take the lead in this great movement of the people for peace.

Resolved, That W. W. Holden has earned the lasting gratitude of the people of North Carolina, by his bold and manly defense of the rights of the State and the freedom of the people - that we heartily commend the Standard to the patronage of the sons of liberty as a proper exponent of republican freedom, and his press and person to their special guardianship.

Resolved, That we call upon the citizens of the several counties of this State who are favorable to a speedy peace and are unwilling to see their beloved old North State overrun and made a ruin, in case speedy negotiations are not set on foot by the government to secure peace, to old delegates to a State Convention who shall place North Carolina in a position where she can negotiate for herself as a sovereign State.

Resolved, That we recommend to the people everywhere to preserve law and order inviolate, and that while they firmly and determinedly maintain their rights and resist the aggressions of tyranny or the imposition of despotism, be it from what source it may, they frown down all mob violence and resist all injury to the persons or property of those who have made themselves obnoxious to the people by their conduct.

Resolved, That the solemn and momentous duty now rests in the Providence of God upon the people of this State to decide whether they and their children shall be and remain free - whether this uncalled for and wicked war that is now filling the land with mourning and causing our fair heritage to become a desolation, shall be ended by a speedy peace; that we will seek the aid and guidance of God and bend all our energies to accomplish our holy and benevolent work.

After the adoption of these resolutions, the assembly called for W. M. Mebane, Esq., Rev. Mr. Bowman, Rev. Mr. Welker and the Chairman, who severally made short addresses. The following resolutions were then passed when this large meeting was adjourned;

Resolved, That the proceedings of this meeting be published in the Greensborough Patriot and the Standard.

Resolved, That the thanks of this meeting be tendered to our Chairman for the efficient and satisfactory manner in which he has presided.

Resolved, That we adjourn to meet at the call of the chairman. JEREMIAH CLAPP, Ch'n.

C., in the year 1838. Thirteen years later he came with, his parents to Arkansas and settled in the northeast section of the state, and has spent his entire life in this part of Arkansas. Mr. Albright has been interested in several industries and retired at a comparatively recent date. He was a merchant for many years and also operated a gin and a mill. He was a planter, and at one time operated a hotel. Mr. Albright makes his home in Batesville with his son and daughter.

His son, J. G. Albright, of Newport, is one of the most celebrated and popular educators in this section. For the past ten years he has been Jackson county superintendent and recently was honored with a reunion at Cave City, given by more than 200 of his former pupils from six states and every county in this section. Gray Albright, a grand son, is sheriff of Jackson county, serving his first term and renominated in a recent primary without opposition.

Mr. Albright is the father of 14 children, 10 of whom grew to manhood and womanhood. Eight are living. Mr. Albright's wife died about seven years ago.

During the war he served as a member of Company B, Fourth Regiment, North Carolina, and served with distinction which marked the Fourth as a glorious band of patriotic sons of the state.

He is survived by three daughters, Mesdames C. F. Overman, Mebane; J. O. Corbitt, Shelby and Charles C. Adams, Mebane; five sons, J. S., Henderson; C. A., Haw River; R. E. and W. H. Albright, all of Mebane; also 37 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

Mr. Albright was a member of the Hawfields Presbyterian church from which the funeral service will be conducted Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock by Rev. N. N. Fleming, assisted by Rev. W. M. Baker, pastor at Hawfields.

"Pioneer Women of Graham Chapter United Daughters of the Confederacy" was interestingly given by Mrs. M. R. Rives at a recent meeting of the local chapter. The history as reviewed by Mrs. Rives follows:

The New Universities dictionary tells us that a pioneer is "a soldier of person whose business it is to clear or repair roads, etc., before an army" or "one who goes before to prepare the way for another." As we go into a study of this sort we wonder what there was in the lives of these women or in their background to inspire them to open up these new trails.

In a day and time when "women's place" was "in the home" and and "children should be seen and not heard" it took much courage for women to form an organization which would put them much in the forefront and attract the eyes of the public to them: but women of the sixties have never been accused of being cowards when "duty" was in question. Lo, we find that in Nashville, Tenn., in 1891 an organization was formed which was destined to become two years later "The United Daughters of the Confederacy." Six years later the North Carolina division was formed, and eight years after this, October, 1905, the Graham chapter was formed. This was during the time that Mrs. H. A. London, of Pittsboro, was president of the North Carolina division and she gave us much aid and encouragement. This being the last chapter organized in North Carolina during her regime she called us her "baby chapter" and took a great pride in her strong infant, as is the nature of parents.

As we look over our chapter and see the names recorded there we cannot keep the tears away for they have everyone been personal friends or even relatives; and so many of them have "gone before" or "blazed the trail" not only as to earthly things many of them have passed on into eternity. Now can we in the midst of our tears fail to straighten our shoulders and throw up our heads in pride and admiration of those who have led in the work of this great organization in which we feel so much satisfaction.

I give brief sketches of the records of our 21 charter members as follows:

Mrs. J. A. Long, born in Alamance county in 1856, daughter of Donald P. Teague who belonged to Company G. 2nd North Carolina calvary, was also the wife of a Confederate veteran.

Jacob A. Long who belonged to Wright's battery colt's battalion of artillery, A. N. V. Mr. Long was in service until the close of the war and was paroled from Greensboro in April, 1865.

Mrs. Long was second president of the Graham chapter, an active member as long as she lived in Graham. She was made an honorary member after leaving Graham and was interested in our chapter until her death last year.

Mrs. J. N. H. Clendenin, (Bettie Long) was born in Alamance County.

Her husband belonged to Company H, 5th North Carolina volunteers where he served till the close of the war.

Mrs. Clendenin was never an active worker in the U. D. C., abut was interested in the work as long as she lived.

Mrs. J. W. Harden, daughter of Col. William Reade, born in Person county in 1841 was the wife of J. W. Harden who was in the Confederate navy, listed as "Seaman Company F. Navy battalion, C. S. A. He served under Commander Tucker, was in Charleston during the period 1864 - 65, was at Harper's farm, taken as prisoner to Point Lookout, Md.

He was discharged June 27, 1865.

Mrs. Harden was a loyal member until her death in 1910.

Mrs. C. B. Erwin, who Mary Speer, daughter of Thomas D. Speer, of Sumpter county, Georgia, who was unable, on account of age, to do active service in the army, but contributed liberally of his means to the cause of the Confederacy, joined the U. D. C., on the record of her uncle (Capt. B.T. Johnston) Company A, 27th battalion, Georgia volunteers, who served until after Lee's surrender, and was paroled from Greensboro, April 26, 1865. Mrs. Erwin was third president of Graham chapter and it was largely thought her interest and perseverance that our lovely monument was erected.

Mrs. Erwin moved to Fayetteville a number of years ago but retained her great interest in our chapter. She was made an honorary member, which membership she held until her death last year.

Mrs. J. L. Scott was the daughter of Rufus A. Brady who first belonged to Company C, 37th North Carolina regiment and was later sent by the governor to South Carolina where he had charge of a department in the railroad shop. Mrs. Scott was the fifth president of the chapter and a loyal member until after she moved away from Graham. She now lives In Greensboro.

Mrs. E. S. Parker, born in Johnston county in the year 1842, was wife of Capt. E. S. Parker, who was a member of the Goldsboro rifles and went with his company to Fort Macon on Monday after the fall of Fort Sumpter. Here he remained until he and others in response to call for troops, raised Company H. of the second regiment. He was afterwards appointed A.C.S. in the 50th regiment. Captain Parker was captured, carried to Old Fort and held in close confinement on scant rations for weeks. After this he and about 90 fellow prisoners were put upon a transport named Maple Leaf and under guard started for Fort Delaware. Soon after leaving Fort Monroe, these prisoners, in midday, captured their guards and took possession of the vessel. Seventy-six of these men escaped and after abut two weeks they reached Weldon, N. C. without a man missing. Mrs.

Parker, was first president of the chapter always presiding with grace and dignity. During later years, because of sickness of her husband and later her own frailty, she was not able to attend meetings but her chapter was ever near her heart. She died in 1925.

Mrs. J. Edgar Long was born in Halifax county North Carolina. The daughter of D. B. Bell, Company I, first North Carolina regiment who was discharged April 9, 1865.

Mrs. J. D. Kernodle, (nee, Cora Harden) joined on the record of her uncle, J. W. Harden, whose record is given in the Sketch of Mrs. J. W. Harden.

Mrs. Kernodle was sixth president of the Graham chapter and had the distinction of serving four consecutive years and our chapter history says, "Mrs. Kernodle had done such fine work that in 1919, Mrs. Harvey, president North Carolina division made her leader of the sixth division. We all call her passing on Christmas morning, 1932.

Sadie Hines, (later Mrs. Theo Pomeroy) came to Graham from Caswell county, joined on the record of her father, Edward H. Hines, who enlisted in April, 1861, at the age of 16 years in the Milton Blues 13th regiment. This regiment was afterwards called the Border Rangers 45th North Carolina regiment.

At the age of 17 years Mr. Hines was promoted to lieutenant by Jefferson Davis. He served on the staffs of Generals Daniel and Given. Mrs. Pomeroy moved to Milton where she died a number of years later.

Ava Clendenin, later Mrs. C. M. Lance, was a daughter of J. N. H. Clendenin and joined on the record which is the same as that of Mrs. J. N. H. Clendenin. She died a number of years ago.

Miss Alice Bason was the daughter of Capt. James D. Bason. Mr. Bason was paroled from the service after 1865. Miss Bason was an active member as long as she lived in Graham and from the records she did much and efficient work on various committees.

Mrs. D. S. Thompson who was before her marriage Sara White, joined on the record of her husband who belonged to Company H, 5th North Carolina Volunteers, serving until the close of the war, although too modest and retiring for aggressive outside work her loyalty to the chapter was never doubted and her love for it never flagged even with years of blindness and physical infirmities. She died several years ago.

Mrs. C. A. Thompson joined on the record of her father, J. N. H. Clendenin, whose record has already been given.

Mrs. Thompson was first secretary of the chapter and served for four years. There was a period through which she could not attend meetings so withdrew from the chapter, but has been back in the chapter and active for the last three years.

Mrs. J. N. Williamson joined on the record of her husband who belonged to Company A. 13th North Carolina regiment but was also a sister of James H. Holt, Alexander Holt and L. Banks Holt. The latter served in the 6th North Carolina regiment.

Mrs. Williamson was never an active member in the chapter but was always interested and gave freely of money for needs of the chapter. She had been a confirmed invalid for several years and is now in a hospital in Martinsville, Va.

Mrs. T. A. Albright was a daughter of W. J. Page who belonged to Company D. 19th battalion, S. C. calvary and served until he was paroled from Greensboro at the close of the war. Mrs. Albright died during the first year of the chapter's existence.

Mrs. Giles Mebane was our oldest member at the time of organization. Also the first of our member to be taken by death. She was the widow of Giles Mebane who belonged to the convention that carried the state out of the Union. Mrs. Mebane gave personal aid to soldiers by knitting and sewing. She was one of the number of women who stood all day and wrapped lunches for Johnston's army when they marched through.

Mrs. George W. Long joined on the record of her husband who was a cadet at Hillsboro Military academy at the age of 16 years, when Governor Vance called for the aid of 100 of the largest boys of the academy to help drive General Stoneman and his troops from the state. Dr. Long was one of this group and served the governor through the remainder of the conflict.

Mrs. Long was ever an interested member of the chapter. She died several years ago in Statesville, where she went to live with her daughter after Dr. Long's death.

Mrs. W. R. Goley (Lou Coe) was born in Guilford county, daughter of Lorenzo Hurley Coe, who belonged to Company (E5??) 15th regiment and died of fever while in service. Mrs. Goley I'm glad to say is still an active daughter in our chapter.

Miss Mamie Parker joined on the record of her illustrious father whose war record has already been given, Miss Parker has always been active in her much loved chapter, was president for two years and is now a division officer.

Miss Bert Albright, (now Mrs. Frank Moore) was a granddaughter of J. G. Albright who was first a member of the home guards, later enlisted in Company A. SR reserves 73rd regiment. He was in the retreat before Sherman in his march to the sea. He also fought in the last battle of Bentonville and was in service until the close of the war.

In addition to these I find in the minutes that among the charter members were: Mrs. D. A. Long, Miss Carrie Long, Miss Louise Holt, Miss Bess Scott, Miss Mattie Holt, though I do not find that they were ever at a meeting.

I do find that Mrs. E. C. Murray and Miss Annie Harden were active members from the beginning, though not named on the charter or in those first minutes.

Of the 21 charter members seven were wives, 10 were daughters, one was granddaughter, two were nieces and one grand-niece of Confederate veterans. These women understood the work of preserving Confederate history, memorializing the dead, and aiding the living veterans and widows of the Confederacy but I imagine they would be amazed could they know the volume of work accomplished by their chapter through the years.

I would that those who have gone before could know of many of these things. Imagine their joy should they pay a visit to the Woman's home at Fayetteville.

Think of their pride in the boys and girls whom we've helped to educate! Wouldn't they rejoice in the healing ministrations of Bessie Bell Reid bed fund.

How lovingly they would give to Mrs. Norman V. Randolph relief fund. How they would enjoy our beautiful highways.

We find that of the 21 charter members of our chapter only three are now active members. These are Mrs. W. R. Goley, Mrs. C. C. Thompson and Miss Mamie Parker.

Miss Alice Bason. Miss Hallie Irwin, (now Mrs. L. Banks Williamson) and Mrs. J. L. Scott are living elsewhere but probably active in their chapters. Mrs. J. N. Williamson is an honorary president of this chapter.

Twelve have truly "gone before." May we carry on as a good soldier and bequeath to our successors strong hearts, quick minds and aggressive spirits for this work so nobly undertaken by our "pioneers."
